AUGUST 2022 - START OF A NEW YEAR

Sports Complex ~ Wrap Up

All the advertising signs, dust & wind breakers, and batting cages have been stored for the season.

Programs ~ Sign Up

- Flag football sign up is in process; practices begin on September 12.
- Figure Skating sign up is Monday September 19, from 4:40 6:30 pm.
- Hockey sign up is online via_GAHA

Business ~ A New Fiscal Year

- New officers were elected for the new fiscal year. Carissa Nelson is the president, and Don Hanson, the vicepresident.
- The budget was adopted; a \$3500 increase to \$482,800.
- The levy will be certified for the 2023 tax year at \$350,000.
- Consultation with Community Economic Development Association (CEDA) is in process for help finding funds for the projects previously reported.



SEPTEMBER 2022

Arena:

- Ice goes in the week of October 10; skating begins October 17.
- A new water fountain that accommodates water bottles was purchased.

Programs

• Flag football has 38 players in grades 4 - 6; play offs will be Monday (10/10) and Tuesday (10/11) at 5 pm, at Nixon-Barle Field.

- Figure Skating sign up was successful with 54 skaters so far. The club webpage has been updated with the current officers and contacts.
- Basketball sign ups for both girls and boys will be October 12 from 5-7 pm

Business

• Work to find matching funds to replace the arena's flat roof portion, and to upgrade the compressor & cooling tower, continues; hopefully success will come from IRRRB. The parking lot and greenspace improvements have been postponed.





OCTOBER 2022

Programs

- Flag football play offs resulted in the STEELERS winning. Andy Sertich [kudos] helped make the program successful while Pat Guyer had a shoulder replacement.
- Figure Skating participation is up with 84 skaters; 30 in the junior/senior level.
- Hockey numbers are approximately the same as previous years: 2 teams each of Bantams, Peewees, Squirts, and 3 teams each of Mites and Mini-Mites. Games start the first weekend in November.
- Basketball season for boys and girls in grades 3 to 6 is October 29 December 23, followed by tournaments.
 Basketball season for boys and girls in grades 1 to 2 is during the months of January and February. Nick
 Porter is the contact and the basketball webpage was updated to reflect changes.

Business

- Still in process: work to find matching funds to replace the arena's flat roof portion, and to upgrade the compressor & cooling tower, continues; hopefully success will come from IRRRB. The parking lot and greenspace improvements have been postponed.

NOVEMBER 2022

Business

- Heard positive report from Amanda Dick of Glorvigen | Tierney | & Co who had reviewed finances from the past couple years; she praised a strong comeback after COVID 19.
- Plugging away to find matching funds to replace the arena's flat roof portion, and to upgrade the compressor & cooling tower. Specific information from Commercial Refrigeration (out of Virginia), and another quote for the roof, is being sought for the grantwriting.
- Renewed the health insurance for the two full-time employees albeit a 5% increase.
- Updated the AED (automated external defibrillator) to be sure the pediatric pads were sufficient.
- Purchased replacement batteries for the Zamboni from the GJRA zamboni savings fund.

Programs

DECEMBER 2022

Programs


- Hockey, figure skating, and basketball practices, and competitions, are running smoothly.
- Approved letting boys from Nashwauk in grades 3 6 play with Greenway teams to fill them for the tournaments in February.
- Girls and boys basketball in grades 1 2 begins January 9.

Arena

- Switched to weekly trash pick-up at the arena from Waste Management.
- The arena's sound system is not performing as good as anticipated; needs warranty service.
- In process: Plugging away to find matching funds to replace the arena's flat roof portion, and to upgrade the compressor & cooling tower; discussed with Representative Spencer Igo.


JANUARY 2023

- Recreation Center: The name of the arena will be changed to Hodgins-Berardo Recreation Center and the building's outside signage above the doors will be updated, this spring, to Hodgins-Berardo Rec Center.
- Compressor & Cooling Towers: An ice system update will move forward this spring, albeit grant funding is still in process.
- **Sound System:** The sound system was professionally recalibrated to improve a difference in sound when the building's seating capacity is full, i.e. sounded excellent during practice time, but not during showtime.
- **Bottle Filling Station:** The water fountain for the players was replaced with a model suited for filling water bottles; it was installed in-house by Rock.
- **Internet Access:** The internet password has been changed, and connections will be limited to administration. The change will secure the concession stand's financial transactions. There will be no public access.
- Code of Ethics: Not just for players and parents, but now in process, a code of ethics for the GJRA board members. President Carissa initiated the process which will clarify expectations of officers and board members'.



FEBRUARY 2023

- Summer Ice: The upgraded compressor & cooling towers have been shipped and will be installed in time for expanded ice time this upcoming summer (June 12 July 30). The rental rate for summer ice will be \$183 per hour; details in process.
- **Arena Roof:** A grant application from AEOA has been submitted. GAHA has earmarked monies to contribute to the roof and compressor/cooling towers upgrades.
- **Defibrillator:** The existing device cannot be updated and needs replacing; a grant to the Baich Foundation has been submitted (approximate cost is \$2300).
- Programs:
- Volunteers were great as they hosted the Peewee B district tournament February 17-19. The following weekend, the Mini-Mites tournament also ran smoothly and was a success.
- o The Ice figure skaters are on track for the annual show, March 18-19.

MARCH 2023

- The arena's ice was remove after the Annual Figure Skating Show,. Batting cage nets are in place for practice by high school players.
- More updates will come after the director returns from his spring break.

APRIL 2023

Memorial Donation: The family of Jim Gibeau created a honor board of past and present Greenway Hockey Division I scholars to be displayed at the arena; the 4' x 8' installation is above the lobby's viewing windows, lighting is in process to highlight the gift.

Summer Ice: Most of the ice time (June 12 - July 30) has been scheduled; only a few evenings in July are open; the rental rate for summer ice is \$183 per hour.

Arena Upgrades:

- Compressor & cooling towers Itasca County pledged to contribution \$50,000 toward this upgrade.
- Roof, parking lot, and playing field Grants are still in process through IRRRB and other sources.
- Water softener Range Water was awarded the bid for a replacement unit; \$5450.00. [FYI: softer water makes better ice]

Summer Ball Programs: Registration will be in-person May 2 & 3 from 5 pm to 7 pm; deadline is May 11. Details in process.

MAY 2023

Summer Ball Programs

- GNK Fastpitch: the numbers are up this year; the reason is partially because of teamwork with Nashwauk-Keewatin. Both Pat Guyer and Kerby Gernander will work together to keep this program successful. These are the teams and number of players:
- 8U has 21 players
- o 10U has 17 players
- 12U has 15 players
- 14U has 15 players
- 16/18U has 7 players
- T-Ball: 49 players
- Squirts: 54 players
- Little Titans: 34 players. Note: organization of an 'Itasca League' is in process between Grand Rapids, Deer River, and Greenway.

Summer Activities

- Ball programs are in full swing.
- Figure Skating is going good.
- Hockey Camps are proceeding as contracted.
- Camp Hiawatha (an annual summer user) is in process a negotiating a fee.
- The new compressor and cooling tower is holding the ice temperature better.

- There will be a Lightning Hockey tournament prior to the ice removal on July 29.
- AEOA is assisting with grantwriting for another round of applications (August 1) to IRRRB for the roof replacement.
- A part-time assistant postition will be posted.
- An event in September will be held at the arena by the VFW to honor Vietnam War veterans stay tuned.
